
President's Mote





New Donation Applications!

Also, new to 2023 are our donation applications! Non-Profits seeking funding now have the opportunity to complete a Giving Request Form. These forms play a crucial role in helping us organize requests and maintain detailed records of fund allocation. The two available applications are the Annual Giving Application and The Planting Fund Application.

The Annual Giving Donation form serves as an application to request funding from our annual fundraising total. Submissions for this application are due on December 1st each year, with donations distributed at the end of the calendar year.

The Planting Fund, established by former President Gini Plant in January 2023, allocates a specific amount each year for St. Johns County non-profits. This funding is accessible through the Planting Fund Application at any time, allowing us to contribute throughout the year. Funding decisions are contingent on availability and are determined and distributed following a board vote. Both forms can be found on our website under "Get Involved" - "Non Profits"
